

Draft minutes for adoption at Wing Parish Council Meeting of 25th May, 2010.

MINUTES of a meeting of **WING PARISH COUNCIL** held on **Tuesday 27th April, 2010** at 8.00pm in The Small Hall, Wing.

241. APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES:-

The minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday 30th March, 2010 were approved by the Council.

242. YOUTH MATTERS:-

The Youth Council are ready to submit their application for funding.

It was agreed that the PC would have a stall with the Youth Council at the Carnival. The Youth Council have four meetings planned prior to the Carnival.

243. COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORT:-

HS2 – High Speed Trains – Both Councils have made statements objecting to the proposal to build a high speed train route through the Chilterns on the grounds that the case has not been proved and they don't want it tearing up such a huge swathe of areas of outstanding beauty nor uprooting thousands of people from their homes. Bucks County Council have added to their objection that if a route is to be built to Birmingham then they support the West Coast Main Line route with a stop at Milton Keynes. This is not the line that goes through Leighton Buzzard but I have yet to be given a clear indication of exactly what is meant by this. It is irrelevant anyway because the Government ruled out that route from day 1. I had to leave the BCC meeting before the agenda item was reached but had I stayed I would not have supported a proposal to bring high speed trains so close to our area. Crime Prevention – we should all know about Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111 where you can report crimes anonymously and the non emergency police number on 0845 8 505505. Now there is a way of finding out what crimes have been committed in a given area. It is called I: on Bucks (Eye on Bucks!). Visit the website on www.ionbucks.info. It is particularly useful to check out the crime level if you are planning to move to another area. Libraries will have access to the site on their public computers as well as leaflets.

While on crime – The Local Community Partnerships are working hard to help people protect themselves against distraction burglaries. The elderly are particularly vulnerable to this type of crime. A few tips – Use a door chain when answering the door, Check that the ID of the caller is genuine. Ask the trader to come back with an arranged appointment, Ask trading standards about setting up a No Doorstop Selling Zone in your road.

Driving Assessment Scheme – After testing the idea on 50 volunteers BCC is launching a Business Driver Assessment Scheme to help motorists drive more safely for their companies. There is a subsidised fee of £42 for the two hour session. Each practical on-road assessment, with a qualified instructor, will look at driving risks and how best to tackle them, offer advanced driving techniques, with fuel efficiency tips and advice on how to use in-car safety equipment correctly.

Cycle Aylesbury 2010 – A number of promotional cycle events have been planned this summer to encourage people to get back onto their bikes. There are recycle a bike days (for children and adults), Bike Week between 20-26th June has breakfasts, supervised or leisure rides, cycle repair sessions, training and cycling giveaways.
