

## Draft minutes for adoption at Wing Parish Council Meeting of 27<sup>th</sup> April, 2010.

**MINUTES** of a meeting of **WING PARISH COUNCIL** held on **Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> March , 2010** at 8.00pm in The Small Hall, Wing.

**PRESENT:-** Cllrs Mrs M Crutchfield (Chair), Mr N Beattie, Mrs C Collier, Mr R Godfrey, Mrs C Hellgren-Derry, Mr P Hawes, Mr S Naghi and Mr J Nixon (Vice-chair),.

### **229. APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES:-**

The minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2010 were approved by the Council.

### **230. YOUTH MATTERS:-**

Cllr Naghi has overseen the Youth Councils application for funding towards the youth shelter. A quote in the region of £8200 including vat has been received for the shelter, and the youth council have applied for £8000 in grants. Initial quotes for the MUGA are in the region of £51, 000 including vat.

### **231. ALLOTMENT SOCIETY:-**

Mr Raw, Wing Allotment Society's secretary, attended the meeting on the Society's behalf. The Council asked Mr Raw what the Society's intentions were regarding the Dormer Avenue Site. Mr Raw reported that the Society is planning to sell the site to developers, with the intention of the whole 6 hectare site being developed by the purchasers. The Council expressed their concern over the site's current state and requested that the Allotment Society tidy up and make safe the area in the interim. Mr Raw informed the Council that the Allotment Society would be unlikely to do this as the costs involved would be too great. However, Mr Raw said he would report our discussions back to the Society at their AGM in May.

### **232. COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORT:-**

High Speed Rail – Both AVDC and BCC have protested about the route chosen by the government. There will be a consultation on the White Paper before a final decision is made. All the local MPs are against the route which will run through some of the most beautiful parts of our county. The public packed the village hall at Quainton to hear John Bercow's views.

Pot Holes – The teams are out every day doing their best to fill the thousands of holes. Unfortunately a lot of them have to have temporary fillings but eventually they will all be planed and finished. The Government has announced that it will give local authorities £100 million to help with the total cost of £300 million to fill the nation's pot holes. When you consider that road users contribute £47bn to the Exchequer each year £100 million is not such a large sum as it sounds! The Oculus – The new Conference Centre/Council Chamber was officially opened on Friday evening. It is absolutely stunning and should bring in a lot of money from organisations who wish to hire it.
